OUR PARTNER

Founded in 1949, the Montjoye Association is an association under the law of 1901. It works in the Alpes Maritimes department in three fundamental areas: the development of children and young people, integration and access to autonomy and support for citizenship.

Each year, Montjoye helps nearly 8,000 socially vulnerable people in the Alpes Maritime department (French Riviera) Its 11 services are divided into 3 poles that promote the reception and support of minors and parents, and cover the fields of child protection and entry into working life:

- · Socio-judicial centre
- · Children in care centre
- · Social and educational centre

PROJECT PRESENTATION

Built in 1932 as a hotel, the Castel Fleury Hotel was a furnished hotel for tourists until 2021. It is listed in the Regional Inventory of Cultural Heritage in the South Region for its architecture.

The two-storey building is in the regional style, with a corner turret that brings it closer to the architecture of Provençal castles. The presence of a genoise, a false dovecote and railings made of hollow tile cladding make full reference to the regionalism and give it a notorious character.

This villa has been completely refurbished to become a shelter for women in pre- or post-maternity situations. These women are in a very precarious situation, victims of domestic or family violence, they are suffering from a lack of housing.

The residence currently accommodates 12 women aged between 22 and 49 and twenty children. There is also a collective part to exchange, recreate links and weave solidarity between the families.

The main goal is the reintegration of those women. A team of eight social workers is present seven days a week to help these women with their orientation, their mental health and their role as mothers.

Today, Montjoye would like to rehabilitate the entire villa in order to accommodate more women in precarious situations.
